Recipe Corner**Baked Beef Stew** *By Marcella Young*

| 1 14½ oz can diced tomatoes, undrained | 2 lbs. lean beef stew meat, cut into 1” cubes |
| 1 cup water | 4 med. Carrots, cut into 1” chunks |
| 3 tbsp. quick cooking tapioca | 3 med. Potatoes, peeled, quartered |
| 1½ tsp. salt | 2 celery ribs, cut into ¾ inch chunks |
| ½ tsp. pepper | 1 med. Onion, cut into chunks |
| 2 tsp. sugar | 1 slice bread, cubed |



In a large bowl, combine tomatoes, water, tapioca, sugar, salt and pepper. Add remaining ingredients; mix well. Pour into a greased 13x9x2 inch or 3 quart baking dish. Cover and bake at 375° for 1 ¾ to 2 hours or until meat and vegetables are tender.

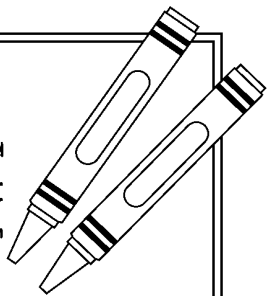

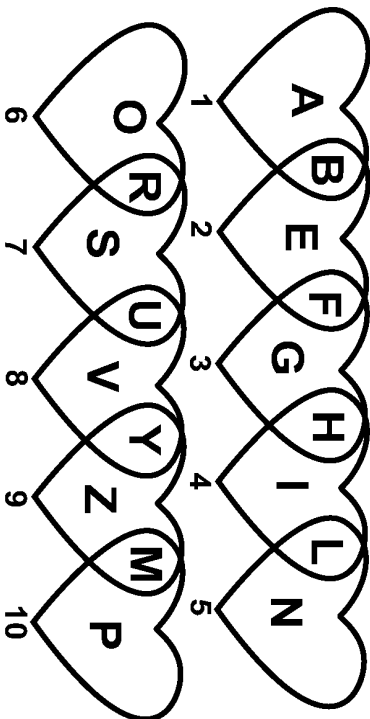
